JOB DESCRIPTION

Wraparound Care Assistant

Main purpose of the job

To work as part of a team, assisting in the day to day organisation and operation of the Breakfast and After School Clubs.

Typical Responsibilities of a role at this level

Key Duties:

- 1. Assist in the provision of a wide range of stimulating play activities which encourage learning through play and co-operation, both indoors and outdoors appropriate to the ages and needs of the children in the club.
- 2. Oversee the supervision of activities and maintain the health, safety, welfare, good conduct and safeguarding of children during Out of School club.
- 3. Assist in the preparation and clearing away of resources on a daily basis before the children arrive and after they leave.
- 4. Report incidents in line with school policy.
- 5. Liaise with colleagues on how to meet any individual pupil needs (e.g. SEN).
- 6. To help organise the collection of children from school and the safe hand over to parents and/or named carers.

Individuals in this role may also undertake some or all of the following:

- 1. Undertake similar work at other times such as during lunchtimes.
- 2. Administer first aid treatments or assist with personal care as required.
- 3. Prepare simple food and beverages as required.

This list is not exhaustive and main objectives/performance measures will be discussed and agreed with your line manager.
